NCWQ - FORUM BURSARY

Forum Communicators is affiliated with the National Council of Women Queensland (NCWQ). The NCWQ was established in 1905 and today continues to represent the voice of thousands of women through its affiliated organisations and individual memberships.

The NCWQ Bursary programme commenced in 2009 and now offers a number of bursaries to Queensland women annually to assist with educational expenses. Forum Communicators sponsor one of these bursaries and we are very proud of our involvement with this programme.

In 2019, the recipient of the NCWQ-Forum Bursary was Anekah Hinchcliff, an inspiring young woman with an outstanding past and a promising future.

Anekah grew up in the South Burnett and is working towards a goal of studying in a health-related field as a result of her own experiences as a rural resident, realising the need to build a network of services that rural communities can access. Anekah is now studying at James Cook University's Rural Health School in Townsville and intends returning to her local community as soon as she can. A truly exceptional young woman - Anekah is a recipient of the Gold Duke of Edinburgh Award, the South Burnett Young Citizen of the Year Award, an ADF Long Tan Leadership and Teamwork Award, The Fiona Carvolth Memorial Shield and James Patrick Bursary (for participation in the school and local community) and the Hilary Powy's Memorial Shield (for Speaker of the Year).
