The Origins of Forum

Forum was founded by three women who had an incredible vision for the future and an understanding of what was needed in our community.

These three women, Lady Jesse Groom OBE, Marjorie Puregger and Ruth Don OAM, called a public meeting in Brisbane on the 22nd of July 1941 for women interested in the formation of a club to foster public speaking amongst women. Ruth Don was the first President of Forum, and the three original founders remained active members throughout their lifetime.

During 1945 a movement grew for the establishment of further clubs, and as the organisation grew throughout Queensland it became apparent that a supervising committee was necessary.

In October 1947 the Association of Queensland Women's Forum Clubs was formed and referred to as Dais. This governing body is now known as the State Committee.

What Forum is Today

After initially being formed to help women find their voice in the community, Forum membership is now offered to men as well, and our clubs are enriched by the diversity of all our members today. Not only do we promote the art of communicating well, our members also learn correct meeting procedure - a skill which is required in most social and sporting organisations. Forum Clubs also enable their members to take on the roles of Office Bearers for their individual committees, allowing these members to fully understand the workings of a committee, which in turn is beneficial for the many outside organisations our members contribute to.

Bayside Forum

In November last year Bayside Forum held a Symposium entitled "Creating a Better Society". Four Forum members each took on a slightly different persona to present their own views on how we can actually achieve a Better Society.

The first speaker was 'Dr' Joy Martin, Anthropologist (Cultural Studies) who enlightened the audience to a world made better by those with an idea or vision to help by making it *Better, Kinder, Richer.* People like the man who invented a pill bottle especially for Parkinson sufferers & opened its patent up for anyone to use or change as the need arose, or the two lads who started Orange Sky – in both cases, blue sky thinking was brought to fruition to make a better world.

The following presenter was Irene Henley, speaking as a Political Analyst, who compared our political systems with the work of bees and their structured industry. Mankind cannot live without bees so is the *Beehive of the Future* the way forward, where collective roles = a better society?

Elaine West took on the persona of Lane Westerman, TIME Magazine Investigative Journalist, and took the audience on a journey to the Svalbard or Doomsday Vault north of Norway, which is *Preserving Global Bio-Diversity through Seed Banks*. She spoke of the purpose of the vault in backing up every seed bank in the world before natural or man-



made disasters, diseases or pests destroy valuable crop varieties. It is truly a global endeavour encompassing every country in the world.

'Dr' Anna Bowman, Specialising in Wellness & Self Care, made the audience look inwards with her topic of *Looking After Yourself*. In today's world where good mental health is so important, it is all about self-appreciation, gentleness and bringing a kind and loving intent to everything we do. Anna advised that the quality of presence, being in the moment and being your own best friend are ways to care for ourselves and in turn make a better society.

All four of our speakers researched their topics intricately and their presentations were wonderful - we do love our symposiums at Bayside!

Featured Member

Pat Pepper, a member of Ashgrove Forum since 1980, comes from a Forum family. Her mother, Mary Pepper, joined Proserpine Forum in 1963 and was President of the Northern Region Council from 1971 to 1973. Pat's sisters, Dorothy Cavill and Gay Gray, have been members of Ashgrove and Cairns Forums, and her sister-in-law, Linda Pepper, was also a member of Proserpine Forum. Pat has held all offices in Ashgrove Forum many times. She has served on the State body (Dais) as Treasurer (1990-93), Chairman of Finance Standing Committee (1994-95; 2006-07), Secretary (1996-97), Vice President (1998-99), President (2000-01), Immediate Past President & New Forums Officer (2002-03); Delegate to National Council Of Women Queensland (NCWQ) for Forum: 1997-99; 2008-present.

Pat has been a keen advocate of the Forum Sister concept. When Brisbane Clubs were paired with country clubs, Ashgrove Forum would meet with their Sister Club at a site between their venues and invite the Forum nearest that location to join them, along with their own Sister Club for a combined meeting. For example, when Ashgrove Forum met in Bundaberg with Sister Club (Capricorn Coast Forum), Sister Clubs (Brisbane City and Bundaberg Forums) contributed to the combined meeting. Another innovation she promoted was the Forum Parliamentary Sessions in the Old Legislative Assembly Chamber, Parliament House. These were possible under the auspices of Mr Jim Fouras, then Member for Ashgrove.

During her Dais Presidency, Pat made a concerted effort to de-mystify Dais and involve other Forum members in the decision making process.

Dais meetings, graciously hosted by local Forums, were held in Emerald, Beenleigh, Ipswich, Mitchell, Gympie and Dalby, as well as at Garden City and Women's Infolink in Brisbane. The Emerald meeting was actually held in two parts: the first in the Stockman's Bar on the Spirit of the Outback on the way to Emerald – much to the amusement of fellow passengers. One chap thought it sounded like such hard work he offered to buy us a drink!!

The highlight of Pat's term of office as Dais President was celebrating the Diamond Jubilee with the **Forum Speaks Out** campaign aimed at lifting Forum's profile and increasing public awareness in an endeavour to increase membership.

The campaign was successfully launched with a Cocktail Forum on 2 March 2001 at the Irish Club in Brisbane, and followed up by an Office Bearer's Workshop on 3 March at the State Library Theatrette. Forums throughout the State conducted a great variety of events and some Forums obtained a grant from a local source to assist funding events. Pat was in awe of the incredible drive and enthusiasm of her fellow campaign team members, Lorraine Foran, Pam Tranter and Norma Knight and the wonderful response from all Forums involved.

When Ashgrove Forum's membership was dwindling, Pat organised "Home" and "Away" meetings with other Forums who were very supportive. These meetings gave members of both clubs the opportunity to speak to a larger and different audience.

A science graduate from the University of Queensland, with higher degrees (M.Sc and PhD.) from the University of Southhampton, Pat spent most of her working life consulting in biometrics, experimental design and analysis, and simulation modelling for the Department of Primary Industries and Fisheries.

Pat has authored and co-authored over fifty scientific and peer reviewed papers, and in 2009, the Department awarded her an Australia Day Award in recognition of her outstanding contribution to QLD Primary Industries. Pat retired in 2012 as Senior Principal Scientist (Biometry). Over the years, Pat has held leadership roles at the State level in various community or professional organisations e.g. Treasurer, Australian Federation of University Women – Queensland; Secretary and President, Australian Society of Animal Production, Queensland; Treasurer, National Council of Women (NCWQ). She is currently the State Environment Adviser and State Coordinator of Advisers for NCWQ, National Environment and Habitat Adviser (NCWA), and Coordinator of four NCWQ bursaries (including the Forum Bursary). When not involved with Forum and NCWQ activities, Pat enjoys the theatre and ballet, playing bridge and golf, and walking her dog. Pat has found the training in Forum very helpful in her working and community life not only to gain confidence when delivering papers, but also to run meetings more effectively. But she is still learning! While Forum provides a supportive and encouraging environment, it can also contribute to our development with challenges. Pat looks forward to tackling those challenges, which she is confident the wonderful camaraderie and friendship she has found in Forum will sustain her in confronting.

Vale Jewel Rose-Thomas

Jewel joined Forum in 1997 and was an enthusiastic and valued member from the very beginning; actively participating in Gympie Forum's Management Committee as well as serving on Forum's State Committee (then known as Dais) in many roles. In 2006 Jewel became Assistant Secretary of Dais and stayed in that role until transitioning to the position of Dais Registrar in 2007. In 2008 Jewel took on the task of Honorary Treasurer of Dais and also served on the Finance Standing Committee at the same time. Jewel held both of these positions for the next two years. Despite her active involvement with the State Committee, Jewel continued to contribute to Gympie Forum's local Management Committee, and from 1999 until the end of 2017 she helped support the club in many ways - taking on the roles of President, Vice President, Secretary, Treasurer and Dais Delegate many times. Jewel was a

shining light in both the Gympie community and the Forum family and will be dearly missed by everyone who knew her.
