Hello, my name is Denise Retchford and I'm a proud member of Ipswich Forum which celebrated its 61st birthday in March of this year. Many years ago when I wore a much younger woman's shoes, I was a member of Ashgrove Forum. This was in the days when the legendary Lettie Morelle OAM was Ashgrove's President. I remember that Forum, at this time, was a much more formal association than it is today. However, I was able under its tutelage to learn how to run a meeting effectively and during my membership of Ashgrove Forum I took on the role of Treasurer and eventually that of President. The picture on the right, taken not long after I joined Forum, shows me (left) and Lettie Morelle at Forum's Annual Conference, which was held



at Lennon's Hotel in George Street, Brisbane. Lettie Morelle co-authored a book with Elise Rathus titled *Speaking in Public*, and although it was first published in 1973 it is still an invaluable guide to all who wish to become good Public Speakers. I believe I have lived, as A.B. Facey writes "a fortunate life". I've been happily married with three children for many years. However, in 1974 my husband was critically injured and consequently became a paraplegic. I feel the strength of mind and confidence gained through my membership of Forum helped me through those early, terrible days. As time went on I let my Forum membership lapse, however



in 2018 I was at a luncheon where I heard a group of ladies speaking about their Forum meeting. I went over and introduced myself to one of the group, Lorraine Foran, who was the President of Ipswich Forum at the time, and as they say "the rest is history".

If you are going to use notes while you deliver your presentation, it is best to memorise your introduction and conclusion. These are key moments - so look people in the eye. With eye contact, the point you wish

to make will strike home far better than if your head is down, reading your notes. If you work with notes, use them wisely. Refer to them - don't depend on them.

Public Speaking Tips from an Artificial Source

At a recent meeting of Bremer Forum, member Campbell MacGregor enlightened his fellow members with an explanation of Artificial Intelligence Applications (also known as AI Bots) which are becoming increasingly popular these days. Campbell entered four key words "Bremer Forum Public Speaking" into an AI Bot on his computer and this is the result:

As an AI language model, I cannot provide personal experiences about public speaking at the Bremer Forum. However, here are some tips and suggestions for public speaking in general.
