Mentors build stronger Forums

The Mentor is viewed as a person for all members.

The Constitution R1.4 says:

The management committee may appoint an appropriate member to the office of Mentor. This office shall be responsible for guiding and assisting new members to achieve understanding and competence in all aspect of Forum activity. They shall hold office until the next biannual / annual general meeting and be eligible for reappointment.

The Bylaws B4 and B5 also have brief mentions that the Mentor is appointed by the committee and also that it's the President's duty to ensure other committee members are mentored within their positions.

The Mentor can brainstorm and offer assistance to a new member on ways they could construct a speech and have a practise session with them – in person or on the phone. Members should be encouraged to rehearse, out loud, at least 3-5 times. Feedback can be offered to the member after the speech has been delivered.

The Mentor could advise newer members of activities and format of the General, Committee, Biannual / Annual meetings, Conferences, Conventions and the speaking competitions.
